Become A Personal Care Attendant (PCA)

The Personal Care Attendant (PCA) program is delivered by MassHealth. MassHealth pays consumer-employers (individuals with physical, intellectual, or developmental disabilities) to hire PCAs to assist with activities of daily living:

- Meal preparation and feeding
- Housekeeping and shopping
- Help with ambulation and transfers
- Support with walking
- Help with toileting
- Help with bathing and dressing

Requirements

- PCAs must be legally able to work in the United States
- PCAs must be able to understand and carry out instructions from the consumer-employer
- PCAs must be 14 years of age or older ([some restrictions apply to PCAs under 18 years of age](#))
- New PCAs must complete a New Hire Orientation training within nine (9) months of their hire date

Career Advancement

On the first day of the second year of employment, PCAs become eligible for:

- **College tuition vouchers** (eight credits free per year) in credit-bearing or degree programs in the information technology, health care or education fields
- **Certified Nurse Aid (CNA) Program** includes the course fee, certification test and uniform

Benefits

- Hourly wage of \$16.10
- Paid family medical leave
- Earn up to 50 hours of paid time off
- Unemployment eligibility
